# Journal of Laryngology and Otology Best Paper Prize Meeting

On 5th May the first JLO best paper prize meeting took place at the Royal Society of Medicine, with prizes awarded to one paper in each of five article categories published in JLO in 2010: Review Paper, Main Article Research Paper, Basic Science Paper, Clinical Record and Short Communication.

Mr G Garas presented a highly detailed review examining the evidence base behind investigations in the selection of patients for OSA surgery.

Prof Stangerup presented an investigation of the predictive value of hearing level at different frequencies and speech discrimination for preservation of good hearing in vestibular Schwannoma treated with a 'wait and see' approach, which was unique in its size, completeness and detail of collected data.

Prof CH Jang presented his work on biopolymer constructed tympanostomy tubes coated with vancomycin, demonstrating significantly reduced staphylococcal biofilm formation in vitro in comparison with uncoated tubes.

Mr R Narayan presented the use of septotomy in the treatment of sinus disease involving the anterior maxillary sinus, which is an efficient method of reducing the need for external approaches.

Mr R Harris presented a case series of eosinophilic oesophagitis. Early involvement of paediatric gastroenterologists was recommended in order to avoid diagnostic failure and oesophageal stricture formation.

Following each presentation a question and answer session was held with the distinguished audience including Visiting Professors Dr Randall Morton and Dr Doug Backhous. Many congratulations are in order to the successful winners and we look forward to next year's awards in anticipation of further high quality articles.
