## 2nd London International Thyroid Forum

he 2nd London International Thyroid Forum followed on from the very successful International Multidisciplinary Thyroid & Parathyroid Meeting which took place in 2011.

Co-organised by Endocrine Surgeons, Mr Neil Tolley (St Mary's Hospital) and Mr Fausto Palazzo (Hammersmith Hospital) this two-day forum proved of great educational value.


The first day involved a practical course on ultrasonography for the thyroid surgeon. It consisted of lectures covering the basics of ultrasonography and FNA technique as well as specimen preparation for cytology. The lectures were given by Dr Gitta Madani, Consultant Head & Neck Radiologist from St. Mary's Hospital. Each lecture was followed by a handson practical where delegates were given the opportunity to practise these techniques under the guidance of experts in the field.

The second day involved a series of lectures and expert panel multidisciplinary team (MDT) discussions. The faculty consisted of world-renowned thyroid surgeons and endocrinologists including Prof Gregory Randolph (Harvard Medical School), Prof Ian Hay (Mayo Clinic), Prof Jeremy Freeman (University of Toronto), and past President of the British Association of Endocrine & Thyroid Surgeons, Mr Barney Harrison (Royal Hallamshire Hospital, Sheffield).

Mr Neil Tolley gave an outstanding lecture on 'New horizons in Thyroid Surgery' presenting numerous technological

advances in the field of thyroid surgery such as single port minimally invasive robotic surgery and computational fluid dynamics in the preoperative evaluation of the airway in patients with retrosternal goitre.

Another brilliant lecture was given by Mr Guri Sandhu from the National Centre for Airway Reconstruction at Charing Cross Hospital on the trachea and thyroid cancer. Mr Sandhu presented numerous techniques to deal with this complex problem depending on the extent of tracheal involvement complemented by several videos.

There were also ample panel MDT discussions of challenging real-life clinical scenarios which were interactive involving not only the panel, but also members of the audience who were invited to ask questions and contribute to the decision making.
